BULLETIN INFORMATION

LATN 109- Elementary Latin (3 credit hours)

Course Description:

Introduction to grammar and practical vocabulary necessary for fundamental reading skills. Admission to 109 restricted to those who have never studied Latin, who have not studied Latin in the previous five years, or who have a score of L-1 on the placement test.

SAMPLE COURSE OVERVIEW

Latin 109 is designed to offer a structured, sustained practice in reading and analysis of basic Latin, as well as structured analysis of basic elements of the English language. The course will provide classroom instruction, followed by outside assignments designed to solidify concepts learned in class.

ITEMIZED LEARNING OUTCOMES

Upon successful completion of Latin 109 students will be able to:

- 1. Identify verb conjugations (1-4) and three noun declensions; form verb tenses in the active voice;
- 2. Decipher the elements within basic Latin sentences in order to understand what is being said;
- 3. Identify differing forms of words, with the understanding of what each form means;
- 4. Hear and respond to basic commands and short expressions;
- 5. Read with understanding short paragraphs, often modified versions of ancient Latin texts;
- 6. Compare basic concepts of political structure, religious beliefs, and everyday life of the ancient Romans with cultures of today; gain an increased awareness of the impact of Roman culture (especially literary, artistic, and philosophical) on the western tradition.
