James E. Clyburn Health Equity Leadership Awards

The James E. Clyburn Health Equity Leadership Awards recognize the contributions made by individuals and community organizations that have demonstrated a commitment to improving and protecting the health of the community, particularly vulnerable populations with established health disparities. Awards are presented to policymakers, health care professionals, community leaders, and researchers committed to eliminating health disparities and achieving health equity.

There are five award categories:

- **Health Policy Leader in Public Health**

Recognizes state and local government officials who have made a positive impact on the population's health and helped to reduce health disparities in South Carolina

- **Health Care Leader in Public Health**

Recognizes members of the healthcare workforce who have contributed to public health initiatives and helped to reduce health disparities in their patient population(s)

- **Community Leader in Public Health**

Recognizes community organizations and their members who have made major institutional commitments to improve public health and reduce health disparities in South Carolina

- **Leadership in Public Health and Health Disparities Research**

Recognizes a senior-level researcher who has done pioneering research in the public health and health disparities field

- **Emerging Leader in Public Health and Health Disparities Research**

Recognizes an outstanding junior-level researcher (within 10 years of completing their terminal degree) who has made substantial contributions to the public health and health disparities field
